



Corona bonus: Employees receive an extra 1,300 euros

HU employees can look forward to a tax-free bonus: On November 29, 2021, the collective bargaining parties agreed to pay a one-time Corona bonus. It amounts to 1,300 euros for pay-scale employees and 650 euros for trainees and will be paid out with the February pay. In individual cases, payment may not be made until March 2022. The bonus is also an expression of Humboldt-Universität's recognition and thanks to its employees for their dedication and commitment in research, teaching and administration during the pandemic.

Successful election: Julia von Blumenthal becomes new president

Julia von Blumenthal is the new president of HU. She received 44 yes votes and 12 no votes out of 58 votes cast. Two votes were invalid. She is expected to take office in the winter semester and will be preparing for it until then. "In the coming period, I would like to seek contact with colleagues in research, teaching and administration in order to hold initial discussions, to gain a deeper insight so that I can take up my new office well prepared," says von Blumenthal.

Constitutional Commission: Prof. Dr. Martin Heger elected chairman

The new Berlin Higher Education Act may also entail changes to the HU's constitution. Therefore, at its meeting on November 16, 2021, the Council appointed a Constitutional Commission, which began its work on February 16. Prof. Dr. Martin Heger was elected chairman of the commission, and Michael Plöse is vice-chairman. The commission will examine the extent to which changes to Berlin's Higher Education Act will affect the constitution and, if necessary, draft proposals for amendments.

Honor: Anders Prize for literary scholar Joseph Vogl

Philosopher, literary and cultural scholar Joseph Vogl will receive this year's Günther Anders Prize for Critical Thinking. Vogl, who teaches and researches at the Institute of German Literature, is being honored for his entire academic and journalistic work, "especially for his recent work on the theory of the present and modern financial capitalism," according to the International Günther Anders Society in Vienna.
