



Back on campus: the summer semester takes place in presence

The practical implementation is based on a key points paper that the Berlin universities and the Senate Department for Science, Health, Care and Equality have drawn up together which regulates the most important stipulations for returning to campus in general for everyone. "We are finally filling the campus with life again," says Niels Pinkwart, Vice President for Studies and Teaching in the current "Friday after One...". However, it won't be quite like it used to be, because FFP2 masks still have to be worn by staff and students on campus. The distance requirement also still applies. It is recommended to stick to the 3G regulation. Digital teaching will not and should not disappear completely from the curriculum. The Vice-President reports on how this will continue in the video.

HU in dialogue - on 6 April: How do we deal with personalities in the history of the HU who have become a target of criticism?

On Wednesday, "HU in Dialogue" will focus on highly esteemed personalities from the history of Humboldt-Universität who faced social criticism. Just recently, for example, the founder of quantum physics and Nobel Prize winner Erwin Schrödinger, who taught and did research at Friedrich Wilhelm University, made headlines. What is there to the allegations of sexual assault? Should the lecture hall and seminar building which are named after him on the Adlershof campus be renamed? How should a university in general deal with its historical role models? And what experiences have other Berlin universities had with the topic? These and other questions are the subject of the online discussion "Schrödinger, Butenandt & Co - how do we deal with historical figures who have come under criticism?" from 3 to 5 pm. Following the panel discussion, all Humboldtians are cordially invited to contribute their perspectives.

University management: Dr. Ludwig Kronthaler resigns from office

Dr. Ludwig Kronthaler, Vice President Budget, Human Resources and Technology, is stepping down from his position at the end of September. "I am firmly convinced that the BerlHG amendment of 14.9.2021 is detrimental to science. University autonomy will be restricted, academic freedom will be curtailed and new bureaucracy on a large scale will hinder science. For about 25 years, I have worked to improve the framework conditions for science. I don't want to have to participate in the implementation of deteriorations now," Kronthaler justified his resignation last Friday. The amended Berlin Higher Education Act (BerlHG) stipulates, among other things, in the controversial paragraph 110, that a follow-up promise of permanent employment must be agreed upon with young academics holding a doctorate. Other provisions of the amendment have far-reaching consequences and in some cases deeply affect the current structure of Berlin's universities.

Interview: "University collections are dynamic entities".

Oliver Zauzig is the new central collections coordinator. Collections have occupied him since his student days at HU, when he took courses in digitisation at the Helmholtz Centre for Cultural Technology and was involved in the digitisation and research of collections. Since then, one research project after another on the topic of university collections has lined up on his CV. Since 2019, Zauzig has headed the nationwide coordinating office for academic university collections in Germany, which he helped to establish in 2012.
