Campaign: Stem cell donors wanted for Alea on 1st of June

For many people suffering from leukaemia, a stem cell donation is the only way to escape death. Two-year-old Alea from Berlin can only survive with a stem cell donation. But she has such rare tissue characteristics that no matching donor has been found anywhere in the world. Katja Schmitt, professor of sports didactics and teaching research at the Institute of Sport Sciences, wants to help Alea, who is being cared for in her sports project for children with cancer. The professor and students will be at the Mensa Nord (Hannoversche Str. 7) and in front of the Grimm Centre (Geschwister-Scholl-Str. 1/3) on 1 June from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. and will be holding a registration campaign with the "DKMS gemeinnützige GmbH": They are looking for a stem cell donor for Alea. Humboldt Talk on 2nd and 29th of Juni: Science in the Open Air

In the small event series "Humboldt Talk", experts from the HU spend half an hour exploring the background to current events from a scientific perspective. On 2 June, the agricultural scientist Dr. Jonas Luckmann will explain the consequences of the war in Ukraine for world food supply and what can be done about it under the title "The war in Ukraine and the fight against world hunger". "War Crimes in Ukraine and the International Criminal Court" is the title of the event on 29 June. The lawyer Prof. Dr. Florian Jeßberger will explain what is meant by war crimes and how they are prosecuted. The Humboldt Talk will take place at 12.30 p.m. in the cour d'honneur of the main building. Journalist Katja Weber will lead the discussion.

Event on 15th of June: How science planned war crimes

Between 1940 and 1943, Heinrich Himmler had a total of five variants for the violent transformation of Eastern Europe drafted. Together they formed the planning complex "General Plan East". The key figure in these plans was the National Socialist, agronomist and professor at Berlin University Konrad Meyer. The historian Sven Oliver Müller works on and researches topics of violence in the First and Second World Wars and has now published a paper on the background to the General Plan East entitled "Wissenschaft plan Kriegsverbrechen. The Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin's Dealings with the National Socialist General Plan East". On 15 June, an event under this title will take place with experts from the HU and other institutions. It will be moderated by HU historian Michael Wildt. The event will begin at 6 pm in the Senate Hall of the main building, Unter den Linden 6, and will also be streamed.

Energy price flat rate: gross special payment in September

Prices for food, electricity and heating costs are rising and putting a strain on many households. The Bundestag has passed the second relief package in response to rising energy costs. As part of the relief package, all employed persons liable to income tax are to receive a one-time flat-rate energy payment. It amounts to 300 euros gross, is taxable and is to be paid out in September as a subsidy with the remuneration via the payroll. As soon as further details are known, the Budget and Personnel Department will inform.

Pandemic: continue to wear a mask out of solidarity

Since last week, masks are no longer compulsory at the University: the reduced risk of infection as well as the expiry of the federal SARS-CoV-2 occupational health and safety regulation led to the lifting of the FFP2 mask requirement at the HU. However, as there is still a risk of infection and vulnerable groups should be protected, the university management appeals to all staff and students to maintain proven infection protection measures such as adhering to the 3-G rule and wearing a mask, at least wherever the minimum distance cannot be maintained or several people work together for long periods of time.

Prof. Dr. Martin Rolfs has accepted a professorship for General Psychology at the Institute of Psychology, which he will take up on 1 October. Rolfs has been associated with Humboldt-Universität for some time. He was Emmy Noether Group Leader at the Bernstein Center for Computational Neuroscience Berlin and then Heisenberg Professor at the Institute of Psychology.
