



## Construction: Foundation stone laid for a modern sports hall on the Adlershof campus

A construction process without delays, mishaps and accidents was what HU as the building owner and all those involved in the project wished for last Friday at the laying of the foundation stone for the 3-field sports hall that is being built on the Adlershof Campus at Rudower Straße 18. To keep the fortune going, a Berlin daily newspaper, tennis balls and a folding rule were stuffed into the copper cassette, which was then bricked into a deep building block. If all goes according to plan, then next summer students of sports science as well as participants of university sports will use the modern hall as well as the outdoor areas. The design planning for the sports hall was prepared by the Technical Department, which is also responsible for project management. The new ten-million-euro building with a photovoltaic system on the roof is being financed in equal parts by the state of Berlin and the HU.

### Interdisciplinary: HU joins Climate Change Center / Call for research projects until August 31

Humboldt-Universität is now a member of the Climate Change Center Berlin Brandenburg (CCC), an interdisciplinary center for research and knowledge transfer at Technische Universität Berlin. As a joint project of the four Berlin universities, the Charité, the University of Potsdam and the Potsdam Institute for Climate Impact Research, the CCC investigates issues of mitigation of and adaptation to climate change.
