#### Payroll: What will change from January 2023

As reported, HU switched from the LOGA payroll system to SAP Payroll as of January. This is also associated with the introduction of Employee Self Services (ESS), which employees will be able to use to download their payroll digitally in the future. There are also changes in the appearance of the payroll. Unfortunately, a simple comparison in terms of content is only possible to a limited extent. At the beginning of 2023, a number of legal changes came into force. The Budget and Human Resources department provides employees with information on the intranet about the legal changes as well as explanations as to what may be the reason for deviating figures.

#### Future fields: apply for Interdisciplinary Centers until February 28

Humboldt-Universität invites applications for new Interdisciplinary Centers (IZ) for the year 2023. These are temporary research facilities, designed to last up to ten years, in which scholars work together in a cross-disciplinary research program. IZs are considered experimental fields in order to discover and advance possible areas of profiling of the university in science. All professors at HU are eligible to apply. Expressions of interest will be accepted until February 28. The deadline for full proposals is May 31.

#### **Gropius Bau: HU Students Design Guided Tours**

## Federal Constitutional Court: Martin Eifert is a judge in Karlsruhe

Martin Eifert was elected judge at the Federal Constitutional Court by the German Bundestag in December on the proposal of the Green Party. He succeeds Susanne Baer, professor of public law and gender studies at HU. Eifert has been a professor of public law, especially administrative law, at HU's Faculty of Law since 2012.
