# New service: automatic transcription of video and audio files

The Computer and Media Service of Humboldt-Universität provides an automatic transcription of video and audio files for all members of the university. After logging in, files up to a maximum size of four gigabytes can be uploaded. The transcriptions are then sent by e-mail as TXT, VTT, SRT or TSV documents. All files and information are processed exclusively on HU servers and deleted immediately after processing. Note: This transcription service is based on the open source software "OpenAI Whisper" and is not 100 per cent error-free.
