



New version of the Berlin Higher Education Act: Here's what happens after the postponement to 2025

On 1 October 2023, the much-discussed new version of Section 110 (6) of the Berlin Higher Education Act was to come into force. It stipulates that academic staff with a doctorate may only be employed on a fixed-term basis for qualification purposes if a follow-up commitment for a permanent position is agreed with them. Recently, the House of Representatives extended the transitional period for the entry into force of Section 110 (6) BerlHG until 31 March 2025. The proclamation is still pending. But what does the deadline extension mean for the employment of postdocs at the HU? And what about the HU's own "2-Pfade-Plus" model as a perspective proposal?

New prize for Citizen Science: apply by 25 September

Participatory researchers at the HU are invited to nominate themselves or their colleagues for the "Knowledge of the Many - Research Prize for Citizen Science". The prize, which will be awarded for the first time in 2023, recognises excellent scientific achievements that illustrate the added value of participatory approaches in a special way. It is endowed with prize money of up to 20,000 euros. The aim of the prize is to strengthen the recognition of Citizen Science in science and to promote the active participation of citizens in research. Nominations for the prize are open until 25 September.

Circle U. Seed Funding: Apply by 15 October for collaborative projects

Anyone who has an idea for a project with colleagues from Circle U. partner universities can now apply for seed funding of up to 10,000 euros for their project. The deadline for applications is 15 October. Interested parties need partners from at least two other Circle U. universities to propose innovative projects: from seminars, workshops, joint modules, courses and programmes to research activities, everything is eligible for funding. Every two years, the Stiftung Deutsches Auswandererhaus and the Deutsches Auswandererhaus award the Kalliope Prize for practical migration research. The team examined Spanish-Chinese manuscripts from the 17th and 18th centuries, which had previously gone largely unnoticed. Klöter's research focused on the linguistic-historical analysis of grammars and dictionaries in which Spanish missionaries systematically documented the Chinese regional language Hokkien for the first time 300 years ago.
