After more than two years of pandemic-related delays, the Central Institute for Catholic Theology (IKT) – on 20 May - and the Berlin Central Institute for Islamic Theology (BIT) - on 8 June - will finally celebrate their openings. The IKT will frame its ceremony with an academic symposium on "Theological Anthropology in Plurality" on 20th and 21st of May, which will be live-streamed. Also available for live streaming will be BIT's opening ceremony. The pandemic did not give an easy start in teaching to both institutes, which began their work in the winter semester 2019/20. In the meantime, both institutes have filled all professorships. Petition: For performance-related pay for secretarial staff

The working group "Pay Equity for Secretaries", which was founded by the decentralized women's representatives, is campaigning for performance-related pay for HU secretarial staff. The stereotypical job description of the "secretary" is no longer up-to-date; the necessary activities in university secretariats have changed considerably in recent years. "These are more advanced clerical tasks that require, among other things, a high degree of independence," the petition letter states, among other things. The AG therefore asks professors and managers in the central institutes, the central facilities and in the university administration to support the cause and sign the petition.

Equal Opportunity Funds: Funds can be applied for until 14th of June

For the winter semester 2022/2023, funds from the Equal Opportunity Fund of Humboldt-Universität can be applied for again. For example, female habilitation students can receive a final fellowship for a period of usually six months and female doctoral students can receive a Caroline von Humboldt final fellowship for a period of maximum six months. Applications can be submitted until 14 June.

Study: How employees develop into leading figures

You are not born to be a leader, but with the right personality, taking on a leadership position is more likely. This is shown by a study conducted by HU scientist Jule Specht together with Eva Asselmann from the Health and Medical University, Potsdam. Even in the years before making the leap to the executive suite, later managers were more extroverted, more open, more emotionally stable, more conscientious and more willing to take risks. Overall, the results make it clear: Leaders grow into their new role bit by bit - long before they even take it on. Consciously helping to shape this process of change can be helpful if necessary - for example, in personnel development or for people who are specifically working toward a leadership position.

Honour: Peter Hegemann Member of the American Academy

Prof. Dr. Peter Hegemann has been named an international member of the Amercian Academy of Arts and Science, one of the oldest and most prestigious honorary societies in the United States, for his outstanding and continuing achievements in research. Hegemann is being honored for the discovery of light-sensitive microbial rhodopsins (microbial proteins) and the use of their properties to develop optogenetics. He has already received a number of prestigious awards for this work.
