# 9 June to 2 July: Open Humboldt Festival and Lange Nacht der Wissenschaften

After a two-year break, the Lange Nacht der Wissenschaften celebrates its comeback on 2 July and will once again take place in presence. Numerous staff members will participate, present their research projects and this time show scientific perspectives on current crises. The topics include conspiracy myths in pandemics of the present and the past, climate change, colonial entanglements of the university, migration and cultures of rejection. The Lange Nacht der Wissenschaften is the climax and finale of the Open Humboldt Festival. Starting on 29 June, the festival will feature some of the HU's most popular public formats on current issues: A Mosse Lecture and a Cosmos Reading address water crises, the Du Bois Lectures recall the Black History of Science. The readings are accompanied by workshops, walkshops and guided tours.

## **Event on 15 June: General Plan East - How Science Planned War** Crimes

Between 1940 and 1943, Heinrich Himmler had a total of five variants for the violent transformation of Eastern Europe drafted. The key figure in these plans was the National Socialist, agronomist and professor at Berlin University Konrad Meyer. The historian Sven Oliver Müller works on and researches topics of violence in the First and Second World Wars and has now published a paper on the background to the General Plan East entitled "How Science Planned War Crimes. The Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin's Dealings with the National Socialist General Plan East". On 15 June, an event under this title will take place with experts from the HU and other institutions. It will be moderated by HU historian Michael Wildt. The event begins at 6 p.m. in the Senate Hall of the main building, Unter den Linden 6, and will be streamed.

The HU information security team, Frank Kühnlenz and Annett Rettke, warns against the 360-degree video conferencing system "Meeting Owl Pro". It has serious security gaps. Devices and cloud architecture are easily compromised so that communications can be intercepted and stored content can be easily viewed. The team recommends shutting it down until appropriate patches are available and installed. While this system is not used by the Computer and Media Service, it enjoys some popularity.

### Honour: Mathematician Member of the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy

Gavril Farkas, Professor of Algebraic Geometry, has been admitted to the Mathematical and Natural Sciences Class of the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy of Sciences and Humanities. Farkas is regarded worldwide as one of the leading mathematicians in the field of algebraic curves. He received his doctorate from the University of Amsterdam. After holding positions at the universities of Michigan, Princeton and Texas, Farkas has held a full professorship at HU since 2007. He has recently been named the first MATH+ Distinguished Fellow. His other awards include an ERC Grant for his groundbreaking research.

### Award: Mira Sievers Member of the Junge Akademie

Mira Sievers, Junior Professor of Islamic Foundations of Faith, Philosophy and Ethics, was inducted into the Junge Akademie in June. Ethical thinking in the Islamic tradition, systematic theology, Islamic theology and gender as well as historical-

critical Quranic research are her main research areas. The Junge Akademie offers outstanding young academics the opportunity to contribute not only interdisciplinary research work but also their ideas for shaping the academic system.
