The Human Frontiers Science Program (HFSP) supports innovative basic research on fundamental biological problems with a focus on novel and interdisciplinary approaches that involve scientific exchange across national and disciplinary boundaries. Funding is provided for international teams of two to four scientists in two funding lines: Early Career Grants for scientists up to 10 years after their doctorate and Program Grants for scientists at any career stage.

### Pandemic: Restrictions in university administration

Peter Frensch, acting President of Humboldt-Universität, is calling on behalf of the university administration with information on how to deal with current challenges in the administration caused by the Corona pandemic. In order to secure the core processes of university operations even as the pandemic progresses and the number of staff absences increases, the departments of the central university administration have agreed with the Presidential Board on a list of priority tasks to ensure, for example, the payment of salaries, the extension of employment contracts or even the security of the buildings.

## Pandemic: Emergency childcare and reimbursement of costs for private care

For employees of the HU, there is still the possibility of receiving selective emergency childcare in the home environment in cases of particular hardship. Lecturers (including student tutors) and MTSVs who, for urgent operational reasons, have an additional childcare need to childcare in a daycare centre, daycare and/or school, can contact the Family Office by e-mail. A new feature is that reimbursement of privately paid childcare costs is also possible. The offer is valid as long as funds are available.
