The Presidential Board of HU has decided to suspend all current cooperation agreements with Russian partners in research and teaching until further notice. In doing so, Humboldt-Universität distinguishes between institutions and individuals. This means: For Russian students in Bachelor, Master or PhD programs at HU these measures have no consequences - they are students of HU.
