Humboldt-Universität has set itself a major goal. It wants to become climate-neutral by 2030, which means that final energy consumption and greenhouse gas emissions are to be significantly reduced. Wiebke Hampel, the university's climate protection manager, is working to make this plan a reality. She is supported by B.A.U.M. Consult GmbH and Öko-Zentrum NRW GmbH. And Humboldtians of all status groups are also cordially invited to participate, for example in the mobility survey that is currently underway. The results of the survey should provide a basis of information for climate-friendly, efficient and student- and staff-friendly mobility strategies. Participation is also possible in the workshops with different focal points. In the course of this year, a climate protection concept is to be developed from the cooperation of all stakeholders and adopted by the Academic Senate.

Pandemic: Clarification on the handling of the XVII Service Directive

An e-mail sent by the General Staff Council to all employees on 7 April with the subject "Ineffectiveness of the XVII Service Instruction CORONA" caused confusion in large parts of the HU and led to a large number of enquiries with superiors and university management. The following explanation is intended to provide you with certainty of action:

With the new SARS-CoV-2 Basic Protective Measures Ordinance, which was only published on 31 March, almost all infection control regulations in the state of Berlin no longer applied, which is why it was necessary to update the service instructions and the framework hygiene plan immediately on 1 April in order to regulate university operations. Due to this short notice, the initiation of the co-determination procedure could not take place with the planned lead time. The regulations made in the XVII Service Directive are indispensable, especially with the discontinuation of the legal basis of the previous Service Directive, and therefore continue to apply until the conclusion of the co-determination procedure for the XVIII Service Directive. Recruitment: Clarification on Staff Council Telegram No. 57

On 8 April, the staff council of the higher education sector announced "further delays" in recruitment processes in its telegram. Staff with little or no knowledge of personnel and representation law understandably communicated that they had difficulty understanding this communication. The telegram may give the impression that changes in the procedure initiated by the Budget and Personnel Department would necessarily lead to delays in personnel procedures. In fact, however, this is not the case, as the Budget and Personnel Department informs us.
