



Teaching mission statement: development process with 350 representatives from all status groups

Humboldt-Universität began drafting a Teachng mission statement at the beginning of the year. Since the first kick-off meeting in February 2023, over 350 Humboldtians from all functional and subject groups have been involved in the participatory process. The Editorial Board has provided editorial support and formulated a mission statement for teaching from the diverse contributions. The final draft will be presented to the committees during the winter semester. "The fact that a diverse team was able to come together in such a short space of time and complete this challenging process of coworking is something I've never experienced before at the university," says Lukas Rösli, Junior Professor at the Northern European Institute. Now the focus is on how the teaching mission statement wants to present itself visually in the future. A workshop on 30 November from 1 to 5 p.m. will therefore focus on the question of what external form the mission statement should take so that it is present and manageable in everyday teaching and learning. All Humboldtians are invited to take part in the workshop.

Committees: Council and Academic Senate meet on 21 November

On 21 November, a meeting of the Council will take place from 9.15 a.m., followed by the regular meeting of the Academic Senate. The third reading of the amendment to Humboldt-Universität's constitution is on the Council's agenda. The draft has been developed over the past year and a half by the members of the Constitutional Commission and also takes into account suggestions from a survey of elected representatives and officials at the university. The current HU constitution is ten years old and needs to be revised in order to fulfil the requirements of the amended Berlin Higher Education Act. The Academic Senate will also deal with the constitutional amendment at its meeting if the Council adopts it on 21 November. Both meetings will take place in the auditorium of the Grimm Centre and will be livestreamed.

Announcement: Day of action against sexualised discrimination and violence on 27 November

The Central Women's Representative and her decentralised colleagues invite you to a day of action to set an example against sexualised discrimination and violence at Humboldt-Universität on the occasion of the International Day for the Elimination of Gender-Based Violence. In the foyer of the main building and at various other HU locations on 27 November from 10 am to 2 pm, there will be an opportunity to talk to the Women's and Gender Equality Officers and find out more about their work. At international level, the United Nations has been dedicating 25 November to the elimination of violence against women for 20 years. The date goes back to the murder of the Mirabal sisters. They were killed by the military secret service in the Dominican Republic on 25 November 1960 because they had defended themselves against the then dictator Rafael Trujillo.

Important: Change for Adobe software from November 30th

Construction: 30 million euros for the Institute of Rehabilitation Sciences

The historic building at Ziegelstraße 5 has been undergoing renovation and refurbishment since the summer. The HU has received 30 million euros for this project from the Senate Department for Science, Health and Care and, unlike many other projects, is the client.

Ten years of BIM: Objectifying the migration debate

The Berlin Institute for Empirical Integration and Migration Research (BIM) at HU is celebrating its tenth anniversary in November. Ideas competition: Social innovations from the university

The BMBF has published a new guideline for funding projects on the topic of "Society of Innovations - Impact Challenge at Universities - Ideas Competition for Social Innovations from the University Landscape". Funding is available for projects that develop and test new solutions for pressing social challenges. The solutions should be social innovations. These can be existing ideas from work at universities or ideas that are first developed and then further developed in the subsequent funding phase. The implementation phase is funded for up to twelve months with up to 175,000 euros per project for personnel, material and travel expenses.

Exhibition, concert and lecture: A history of the domino problem

The domino problem, an algorithmic decision-making problem, is the focus of the exhibition "A few thoughts on how things fit together..." in the east atrium of the main building, Unter den Linden 6. It will open on 17 November at 7 pm and will be on display until 1 December. The exhibition features individual and collaborative works by artists Michael Winter and Mareike Yin-Yee Lee. In addition, mathematician Jarkko Kari (University of Turku) will introduce the topic of the domino problem with his lecture "From Wang Tiles to the Domino Problem: A Tale of Aperiodicity".The accompanying programme also includes the Kali Ensemble from The Hague, which will give a concert on the topic.The concert and lecture will take place on 22 November in the Fritz-Reuter-Saal of the HU on Hegelplatz at Dorotheenstr. 24.The exhibition and programme have been organised by Gaëtan Borot, Professor of Mathematical Physics at the HU.

Over the ten years, 71 female scientists took advantage of the offer to develop their leadership skills and expand their professional network.
