Humboldt-Universität has set up a Centre for Equal Opportunities. The aim is to strengthen diversity at HU and prevent discrimination and disadvantage. With this focus, the new centre brings together all previous activities and institutions in this context under one roof, such as the Office of the Central Women's and Equal Opportunities Officer and the office of the Berlin Equal Opportunities Programme. The Anti-Discrimination and Diversity department has been reorganised under the leadership of Katrin Meinke. She is the central point of contact for staff and students who have experienced discrimination at HU. They can seek advice, report incidents and submit complaints.

Commemoration of the victims of the Reichspogromnacht: HU sets a sign of remembrance

To commemorate the victims of the Reichspogromnacht on 9 November 1938, the HU Presidential Board, together with representatives of the Student Parliament (StuPa) and the Referentinnenrat (RefRat), cleaned the stumbling blocks in front of the main building of the University, Unter den Linden 6, and laid flowers. Remembrance and hope: Sound installation "Mo(u)rning"

Thirteen months after the Hamas attack on Israel on 7 October 2023 and the start of the war, which is still claiming many lives and causing immeasurable suffering to the people in the region, Humboldt-Universität presented the sound installation "Mo(u)rning" by Argentinian composer Juan Pablo Martini. The work, which interweaves voices, poems, prayers and music from different cultures, commemorates the victims and symbolises hope for lasting peace. The installation could be heard every hour on 7 November in the foyer of the HU's main building. An online version will be available on the HU website at the end of the month.

Since 1999, 25 November has been International Day for the Elimination of Violence against Women. On the occasion of the International Orange Days, the staff of the Centre for Equal Opportunities are organising a theme week at the HU from 23 to 30 November. METIS Lecture: Gender inequality in mathematics, on 28 November Gender equality in mathematics has not yet been achieved at German universities.

What are the causes and mechanisms that may contribute to gender inequalities in

Object of the Month: The Collection of Historical Images of Palestine

Five images from Gaza, Aleppo, Baalbek, Beirut and Jerusalem were selected as "Object of the Month" from the approximately 2000 slides in the "Collection of

Historical Images of Palestine" at the Faculty of Theology. Due to the war in the Middle East, the sites are currently at the centre of public attention and are threatened by violent destruction. The photographs were taken in the late 19th and early 20th centuries and depict biblical settings. The majority of the photographs in the collection were contributed by the Old Testament scholar Hugo Gressmann (1877 to 1927). In the "Object of the Month" series initiated by the Helmholtz Center for Cultural Technology together with the HU collections, special objects from the Humboldt-Universität collections are presented. The Schrödinger "case": New findings on 18 November In the ongoing debate about a possible renaming of the Erwin Schrödinger Centre at Humboldt University, new, previously inaccessible sources from Schrödinger's estate, including his diaries and letters from affected women, will be presented at an

event on 18 November. Massive accusations have been levelled against the physicist for two years. These range from paedophilia to sexual abuse and have permanently damaged the Nobel Prize winner's public reputation. Dr Dr Magdalena Gronau and Martin Gronau would like to make a contribution to objectifying the heated media debate with new research findings. The event "The Schrödinger case.
