Knowledge transfer: What does Open Humboldt actually mean?

The Open Humboldt Festival is aimed at all people interested in how science works and what it does for society. The programme includes cosmos readings, performances and workshops by the Theatre of the Anthropocene, performances, a discussion on the connection between tango and migration and much more.

But what is behind the idea of Open Humboldt? Teaching and research have been among the core tasks of universities for centuries. For some decades now, another field has been gaining in importance: the exchange between researchers and society, also called "third mission". Open Humboldt aims at a stronger and more visible role of science in the public sphere, for example by conducting research projects in cooperation with citizens or civil society organisations, but also by the university making scientific and cultural offers such as public lectures, workshops, exhibitions and concerts. The desire is for an exchange to take place which, in the best case scenario, is fruitful for both sides.
