



## ECTS GRADING TABLE 2024

### Distribution of final grades in study programmes leading to the first academic degree (Bachelor)

In order to achieve better comparability between various grading systems, the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin follows the European Union regulations providing relative grades in the form of grade distribution tables<sup>a</sup>. For that reason, the HU Berlin uses a reference group selection based on the International Standard Classification of Education (ISCED)<sup>b</sup>. The data for ECTS grading tables are generated annually. The reference period includes three previous calendar years at the time of data collection respectively.

The ECTS grading table below shows the statistical distribution of final grades, the total number of passed final examinations in the period considered, and the average of the recorded final grades. Description of final grades is made according to para. 114 of the General Study and Examination Regulations of the Humboldt-Universität zu Berlin (ZSP-HU) of 30 April 2013 in the currently valid version.

This document is valid for those graduates who obtained their Bachelor's degree in 2024.
